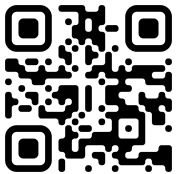

prayer

Romans 12:12 says, “be persistent in prayer.” Prayer is a powerful tool especially as you send your child into a new school year. Entering into every situation, whether in joy or sorrow, with prayer, will benefit your whole family. Scripture also says that the peace of God will guard your heart and mind through prayer. Communicating with God provides that peace of mind that will be needed as you transition to having your child away from you more often, too.

Patterns of prayer can be established quickly if you think about the rhythms of your day. Bringing prayer into your everyday moments will allow for a habit of prayer to be formed as it becomes a natural part of your day. Key times to focus on would be waking up, travel times, meals together and bedtime. These provide great opportunities to turn conversations with each other into conversations with God.

Consider praying for: yourself, your spiritual growth, your marriage, your child, their friends, their teachers, their coaches/leaders, their caregivers, their salvation, their spiritual growth, their safety, their emotions, their attitude, their responses and their future. Use the poster included as you focus on prayer as a family.

personal

Helping your child understand and appreciate the truth about who they are, is even more important as they venture into a new year with unique challenges and opportunities. Pointing your child to who they are in Christ might minimize their confusion and disorientation as they encounter new thoughts and perspectives this year.

Think about unique ways to place these truths in front of your child or as you speak them over them in an effort to remind them of their place in creation. Building their security in knowing whose they are, will guide them through the ups and downs of a world telling them lies.

Cling to the reminder we have in Ephesians 2:10, “For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared ahead of time for us to do.” There is a creator, a sustainer, a provider and a heavenly father your child can trust.

practicals

There are many practical tips that can be implemented to help with school year transitions. Learning a better way of asking questions might be one of the easiest to implement. Every parent wants to know their child, understand their experiences and empathize with them, but it is often uncomfortable, timely and sometimes just awkward to get there. Consider asking some of the following questions as you strive to go deeper in your relationship with your child.

Creating a schedule can also provide the boundaries your child is seeking. It can help them transition back to school and help them balance all their responsibilities once school starts. Most resources point to things like: routine bedtimes, healthy breakfasts, screen time limits, regular dinners as a family, time for physical activity and planned downtime for spontaneous fun. Working to help create that structure can allow your child to live freely within those boundaries as their day to day changes with the start of school.
